# Selangor A Brief History

Selangor is the most developed state in Malaysia and houses the country's largest international airport and seaport, as well as some of the finest infrastructure and communications facilities not only in Malaysia but also regionally.

The state has a rich and colourful history that predates the establishment of the Malaccan sultanate in the 14th century.

Its growing affluence could already be seen in these early days, given its prominence as a main producer and trade centre for tin. In this respect, the Klang River and its port played a major role as the primary point of facilitation for the export of tin to Western traders.

In 1850, Klang was leased to two foreign traders by Raja Abdullah, who was of Bugis descent, for tax collection. This gave rise to a dispute when the son of Sumatran Chief Raja Mahdi refused to pay these taxes, resulting in a civil war that later saw already feuding rival Chinese miners, the Ghee Hins and Hai Sans, joining with the opposing Malay chiefs, thus creating a period of economic turmoil and loss of mining investments. The civil war was finally resolved with the British forcing the Sultan of Selangor to accept a British Resident in 1874, effectively limiting

the powers of the Malay ruler. A Federal Council formed in 1909 intended to further diminish the powers of the Sultan saw dissent on the part of the Sultan and other Malay chiefs, causing the British to reluctantly relinquish greater control to the Sultan. This situation continued until 1941 when the Japanese occupied peninsular Malaya.

Following the end of the Second World War, Malaya was returned to the colonial British until 1957, when independence was achieved. In 1963, Selangor became a part of the Federation of Malaysia, with its capital of Kuala Lumpur becoming the administrative centre for trade, commerce and banking. In 1974, Selangor bequeathed Kuala Lumpur to the federal government, and Shah Alam became its new capital. In 2005, Selangor was declared a modern state and is today the nation's most progressive and economically successful state.


For visitors to Selangor, there are a plethora of places to visit and things to do within the lush greenery that prevails throughout the state, from coastal mangroves to abundant green rainforests. Selangor's cities offer a variety of attractions, activities, adventure sports, shopping, and, of course, a veritable feast of disparate cuisines from which to savour.

Nature lovers will delight in a visit to Kampung Kuantan, with its magical light show comprising thousands of fireflies lighting up mystical mangrove forests while cruising silently down the river. Or, commit to posterity pictures of yourselves perfectly reflected in the Sky Mirror, a natural phenomenon in which amazingly clear reflections emerge on the calm shallow sea on specific days of the month.

Thrill seekers will find an abundance of hiking trails and treks, mountain climbs, waterfalls, and a host of nature-related adventures to test their mettle, including paragliding off Bukit Jugra in Kuala Langat.

Selangor's multiracial population also provides ample opportunities throughout the year to witness and experience a range of religious and cultural celebrations, including the Muslim Eid ul Fitri, Chinese New Year, Deepavali, and more. The Thai Pusam celebrations at Batu Caves have achieved world renown for the colourful and often elaborate 'kavadis' or sacrifices on display to Lord Murugan amidst a boisterous atmosphere.

All of these festivals are naturally accompanied by an abundance of great food and delectable dishes. Decorations, arts and crafts, the welcoming nature of Malaysians, and a culture of 'open houses',

where one and all are welcome to visit and partake of food and entertainment, provide an insight into the rich cultural diversity that makes up the state. Indeed, visitors will find an extensive microcosm of Malaysia, where all roads lead to Selangor and its many cultural and natural wonders.

As with most of the country, Selangor sees more significant rainfall during the earlier and later months of the year, while April to June are the hottest months. That said, the temperature is relatively constant throughout the year, requiring light clothing and possibly an umbrella when the weather dictates.

# Getting Around Selangor

Getting around Selangor is fairly uncomplicated, as there is a choice of trains, buses, taxis, e-hailing, and self-driving. The KTM, or National Railway, connects many parts of the state together, including Kuala Kubu Bharu, Bangi, Tanjung Malim, Klang, and Port Klang. It also connects the state with the federal administrative capital of Putrajaya and the capital city of Kuala Lumpur.

Buses, on the other hand, are plentiful and a primary mode of transportation for many seeking to get around the main cities. Catching a taxi is traditionally an easy option, as these can be found everywhere. The more adventurous might look to rent a car. In contrast, those more predisposed to ensuring a convenient and predetermined destination without the need to circumvent any possible language barriers might look to the many e-hailing services at hand, with only downloading an appropriate app.

Malaysia's primary international airport, the Kuala Lumpur International Airport, or KLIA, is located in the Sepang District of Selangor, around 45 km south of downtown Kuala Lumpur and serves an estimated 60 million passengers annually.

The Subang Skypark Terminal, or Subang Airport, is located in Subang, Petaling District, and operates as a central hub for regional and charter carriers, including Firefly, Berjaya Air, and Batik Air, and attracts travellers due to its convenient location in the Klang Valley.

The Gombak – Hulu Langat Geopark includes the Gombak District and Hulu Langat District, covering 112,955 hectares. In 2022, the Gombak-Hulu Langat Geopark was certified as a national geopark under the Geopark Development Programme. Some of the amazing formations here include the longest quartz formation in Southeast Asia, fossil-rich caves, inland basins, hot springs, and lush mountains.

Visitors to the geopark can avail themselves of several activities, including exploring various geological formations, visiting fossil-rich caves, including the Batu Caves, indulging in hot springs at the Dusun Tua Hot Springs Complex, challenging hiking trips to the granite peak of Gunung Nuang, or taking in the scenic beauty of the Gombak Quartz Ridge. Best of all, these activities are all close to Kuala Lumpur and easily accessible.

**Sabak Bernam District Museum**

The Museum offers visitors the opportunity to explore the history of the district! Artefacts on display include economic activities in the maritime and agricultural sectors such as boats and farming implements, traditional Malay items, and interesting stories about the district's economic and social development.



**Sekinchan Paddy Field**

90 kilometres from Shah Alam is this fishing village best known for its paddy fields, with picturesque sights of an aqueduct, water fowls and vast trenches of paddy fields. Rice harvesting is done around the middle of the year and is an interesting way to discover more about Asia's most popular staple food crop.



**Pantai Redang**

Redang Sekinchan Beach, while being easily accessible for the public, is not suitable for most water activities including swimming or snorkelling. Activities that are available include kite flying, hearty seafood feasts, and watching glorious sunsets!



**Ah Ma House**

This is a charming quick-stop attraction celebrating traditional Malaysian Chinese culture, it also has for sale locally made products including traditional kuih, or sweets, snacks, local rice and rice products, handcrafted souvenirs and traditional herbal drinks. Well worth the brief, albeit informative visit.



**Sekinchan Wishing Tree**

Visitors tie or throw red ribbons onto this large Banyan tree in Pantai Redang in hopes of having their innermost desires and dreams fulfilled. A symbol of hope and positivity, the tree does emanate great vibes and makes for an excellent Insta-worthy destination.



### Sungai Panjang Hornbill Conservation Centre

A couple of red and yellow-billed hornbills usually welcome visitors to this conservation centre. The birds readily greet guests to what is home to some ten species of hornbills in Malaysia out of an estimated 32 species of hornbills found in Asia.



### Homestay Kampung Sungai Haji Dorani

This homestay is popular for visitors looking to experience traditional 'kampung' or village life. Various cultural performances are performed here while the cuisine served also reflects the traditions of the Javanese. Flying traditional kites, batik painting, and lawn bowling are some of the other activities.



### Bagan Nakhoda Omar Recreational Centre

This is a popular destination for visitors, especially those looking for excellent fresh seafood and fishing enthusiasts. There is a jetty from which speedboat rides are taken to the Kelong Paradise, a haven for die-hard anglers. There is also a food court, and various public facilities for visitors.



### Ladang Mangga Sungai Rimau

This is the perfect place for fruit lovers to spend a couple of hours picking and savouring mangos fresh off the trees, depending on the season, of course. The farm also offers dried mangoes for sale and visitors get to see how mangoes are planted, harvested and processed.



### Kelip-kelip Sungai Panjang

This firefly conservation centre is located along the Besar River in Selangor and is a great location to experience the magic of fireflies while cruising quietly down the river. Boats are also available for rent for fresh water prawn fishing.

The Sekinchan Fruit Farm is a must visit destination and a tropical haven for fruit lovers. Visitors here are spoilt for choice with the freshest mangoes, guavas, papaya, bananas, coconuts and more available. Guests are invited to tour the farm before sitting down to feast on some of the most delicious fruits available.



**Villa Chee**

Nestled in the heart of Sekinchan, Villa Chee offers both unique container-styled living spaces as well as modern hotel rooms set among rice paddy fields with panoramic views from your very own private balcony. Enjoy spectacular sunrises and sunsets as you disconnect and stroll along scenic paddy routes or just relax away from the hustle and bustle of the city.

## Be One With Nature

**Kg. Kuantan Fireflies Park**

These magical creatures put on a show every evening in good weather and visitors are taken on traditional wooden boats to cruise silently beside mangrove forests where the twinkling of these delicate insects light up the night. This location is said to have one of the largest colonies of fireflies in the world.



**Bukit Malawati**

Formerly a 16th-century Malacca Sultanate fort, Bukit Malawati has a lighthouse built in 1907 by the British. There is a large population of monkeys, and visitors should be cautious in interacting with these simians. The hill has a commanding view from which to observe the Straits of Malacca and dazzling sunsets.



**Kuala Selangor Nature Park**

This park comprises a 20-hectare tropical rain forest, with the remaining area being a swamp forest and is home to a wide variety of wild birds, including 156 species of migratory birds. Three distinct habitats exist: inland secondary forests, muddy estuaries and mudflats, and a brackish water lake inhabited by wetland animals.



**Sky Mirror, Kuala Selangor**

This fascinating natural phenomenon occurs only on the 1st and 15th days of the lunar month and four days before and after. The seabed appears above water for a few hours at low tide, exposing a vast expanse of very calm, reflective salt flats that literally mirror the sky.



**Selangor Fruit Valley**

The Selangor Fruit Valley has many activities to engage in, including a tram ride, a petting zoo, a herbal garden, fruits, fishing, an orchid garden, biking, and lots more. Also within its grounds are a nursery, rubber tapping discovery, and a traditional Selangor kampung or village house.



### Sri Subramaniam Swamy Temple

The Sri Subramaniam Swamy Temple in Kuala Selangor is a sacred sanctuary dedicated to Lord Subramaniam Swamy, the divine son of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati. This revered temple has been a beacon of faith, devotion, and divine grace for over a century. The temple's sanctum was built in 1915, and over the years, it has flourished and expanded as a place of peace, worship, and cultural connection.



### Remis Beach

This spot has some of the best sunset views over the Straits of Malacca and is a favourite for kite flying visitors who make the most of its windy shores and also cast fishing. There is also an abundance of stalls that sell a variety of fresh seafood. Remis Beach is an excellent choice for a family outing.



### Eagle Feeding Kuala Selangor

This exciting event takes place at Pasir Penampang near the mouth of the Selangor River. Brahminy Kites, hover in anticipation of a free meal. Each feeding session lasts about 45 minutes and is seen from a speedboat. Visitors on the late afternoon tour will usually enjoy spectacular sunsets as well.



### Blue Tears Experience

This remarkable natural phenomenon is made up of blue-green bioluminescence emitted by dinoflagellates, a marine plankton. The ideal time to experience this magical event is on truly dark nights of a new moon and about two hours after sunset.



### Kuala Selangor District Historical Museum

Originally the official residence of the Kuala Selangor District Officer, the museum has a wealth of artefacts and historical data related to Kuala Selangor as the state's earliest administration centre. Kiosks, dioramas and other modern displays enable visitors to appreciate their visit to the museum better.

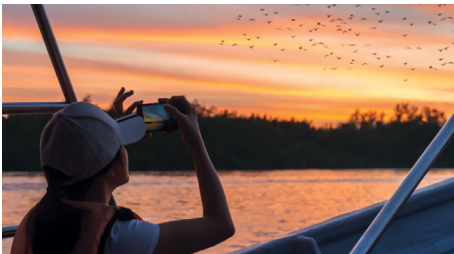
**Tian Hock Temple**

This Buddhist temple is located in the heart of Klang and offers visitors a quiet respite from the hurry and noise of city life. This building showcases intricate designs and vibrant colours with various halls adorned with magnificent statues of deities and beautifully crafted murals depicting Buddhist teachings.



**Taman Agrotek MARDI, Tanjung Karang**

The MARDI Agrotek Park houses a range of activities related to rice cultivation, including everything to know about rice. There are also bicycles available for rides through the paddy fields, fishing and other general information about the bounty of rice and its importance to the people of this region.



**Pasir Penambang**

The Kuala Selangor Fishing Village is located along the Selangor River. It is a well-known destination among locals from Kuala Lumpur and the Klang Valley. Visitors come to indulge in the cheap and fresh seafood available all year round. This is the perfect place to enjoy beautiful, spectacular sunsets.

**Santuari Ikan Kelah Sungai Chiling**

This destination has been gazetted as a nature park and fish sanctuary to preserve the local Kelah or Mahseer fish species. Fishing is prohibited here, and the location is an excellent spot for gentle treks and river crossings to get to the waterfall.



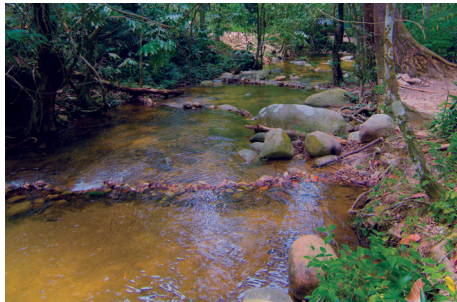
**White Water Rafting Sungai Selangor**

Whitewater rafting on Sungai Selangor, Kuala Kubu Bharu, is an exciting adventure with rapids ranging from grade 2 to 4. Clear waters and beautiful rain forests make for a memorable day for thrills in a truly perfect setting.



**Kuala Kubu Bharu Town Urban Heritage Park**

Kuala Kubu Bharu town was built in 1928 after floods destroyed the old district capital. It is based on the garden city movement in which green belts surround self-contained communities. Activities here include hiking, trekking to the Chiling waterfall, paragliding, white water rafting, and mountain biking.



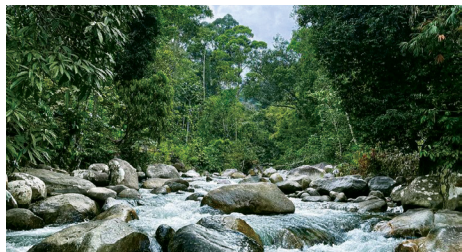
**Sungai Sendat Waterfall**

This is a two-tier waterfall located within lush tropical rainforests with waterfalls located beneath an overhanging rainforest canopy and resulting in cool clear waters that are simply perfect for hot sunny days. Camping, picnicking and BBQ facilities are available here.



### Sungai Dusun Wildlife Conservation Centre

Established in 1964 as a conservation centre for the Sumatran Rhino, the centre shifted its focus to other wildlife species, such as the Tapir and Porcupine, upon the extinction of wild rhinos in Peninsular Malaysia. Visitors hoping to visit the centre must obtain a permit from the Department of Wildlife and National Parks.



### Sungai Pertak

Sungai Pertak is perhaps among the more pristine of Selangor's natural recreational spaces. The location has camping, picnicking and bathing opportunities but as much of the site is still in its most natural state, amenities such as toilets, changing rooms and other facilities do not exist beyond the parking lot.



### Masjid Ampang Pecah, Kuala Kubu Bharu

The Al Hidayah Mosque is a historic mosque located in Ampang Pecah, Kuala Kubu Bharu. Built in 1926, the mosque and the Guan Yin Gu Si Temple are said to have been the only structures to survive the Sungai Selangor dam break.



### Hulu Tamu Hot Springs

Visitors here have a choice of several pools, or 'hydrotherapy facilities' ranging from hot, medium to cool and gazebos, walkways, changing rooms and toilets are available. There is a nominal entrance fee and the facility is open 24 hours daily except for Thursdays.



### Taman Rekreasi Millenium, Kuala Kubu Bharu

This park has a 2.1km loop trail and is generally considered an easy route, taking roughly half an hour to complete. It is also a popular location for camping, fishing, and road biking, and is open year-round and is a beautiful place to visit anytime. Activities include picnics, a playground, cycling and camping.

**Rumah Hutan Bonda Rozita**

The Rumah Hutan Bonda Rozita is a holistic and natural spa and therapy establishment although the location also provides several luxury villas for overnight stays. These well-appointed accommodations are surrounded by natural tropical flora and fauna, giving rise to excellent views throughout the day.

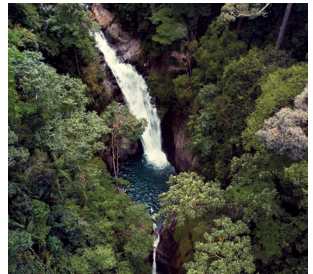

**Sunway Lagoon Theme Park**

The Sunway Lagoon Theme Park currently features 90 attractions spread out over six themed areas. These include a water park, amusement park, scream park, extreme park, Nickelodeon Lost Lagoon and Wildlife Park. The park is open daily from 10am to 11 pm and welcomes visitors of all ages.



**Sunway Pyramid Ice Skating**

This is Malaysia's first world class sports entertainment facility with programmes for beginners to advanced level skating. The rinks open and modern design allows shoppers from five floors to watch skaters in action which for some can be quite an absorbing activity.



**Jump Street Asia Trampoline Park**

This is the first trampoline park in Malaysia with over 9,000 square feet of interconnected trampolines extending right up the walls. Customers can enjoy up to 17 different attractions and facilities which include the Main Court, Foam Pit, Big Airbag, High Performance area and many others!



**Zipline, Taman Tasik Shah Alam**

Zipline Shah Alam is the first public zipline in Malaysia to be introduced by a local council, and offers a safe yet exhilarating experience, spanning a length of 240 metres across the scenic Shah Alam lake. This family oriented attraction uses the most advanced and latest braking system in the world imported from the USA.



### **I-City Shah Alam**

This is a highly sophisticated ICT-based development and fully integrated intelligent city. The i-City Theme Park is a digitally integrated development with shops, ice sculptures and an amusement park while the SnoWalk by i-City is a climate-controlled snow space with ice sculptures and sledding.



### **Perpustakaan Raja Tun Uda**

This is the main public library of Selangor with various facilities including an auditorium, seminar rooms, multipurpose halls, meeting room, cafeteria, a relaxing area and more. The Ground Floor has a Creative Zone and Leisure area and upper floors contain books on various subjects and the Sultan's Collection.



### **Masjid Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah**

The Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Mosque is the state mosque of Selangor and the country's largest mosque, and the second largest in Southeast Asia by capacity. Its most distinguishing feature is its large blue and silver dome. On a clear day it can be seen from some vantage points in Kuala Lumpur.

**Taman Botani Negara Shah Alam**

A typical visit to the National Botanical Gardens here would take between 1 to 2 hours and things to do include bike rides, leisurely walks or jogging. There are also a number of smaller gardens including for cactus, orchids, and spices in addition to an animal park, fruit orchard and more.



**1 Utama Shopping Centre**

1 Utama is a massive shopping mall in Bandar Utama, Selangor containing 713 stores. The mall houses multiple retail areas, restaurants, cafes, sports facilities, a rainforest, and a bus station with national and international services.



**Central i-City**

Central i-City is a shopping mall located in i-City, and is currently the largest in Shah Alam in terms of floor area with a recorded footfall of about 800,000 visitors a month. The mall also houses the largest Samsung Onyx LED cinema screen in Southeast Asia.



**The Curve**

The Curve is Malaysia's first pedestrianised shopping mall with a good blend of food and retail outlets. Its unique appeal is its distinct ambience, refined by its wide canopied walkways and alfresco dining area which is divided into Asian and Western Courtyards, and offers a diverse family friendly shopping experience.



### Thai Buddhist Chetawan Pagoda

Wat Chetawan is a Thai temple in the Petaling District in Selangor. Built in 1957 and officiated by the late King Bhumibol Adulyadej. Its design and construction saw the combined efforts of local and Siamese craftsmen and is the only Malaysian Siamese temple chosen as a custodian of sacred Buddhist relics.



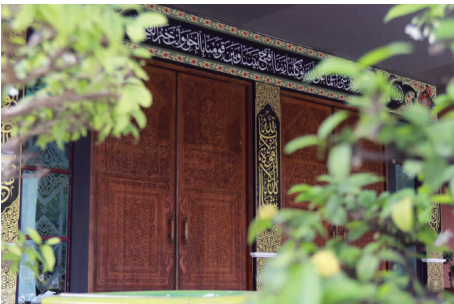
### Beryl's Chocolate Shop & Museum

This tour provides a comprehensive look at the history of the the company as well as the process of chocolate production and a visit to the gallery which educates visitors on the the origins of cocoa, the types of chocolate available, and the ingredients used in chocolate making. There are also vintage machines and a variety of chocolate packaging from around the world. A retail store is also available for purchases.



### Chocolate Museum Damansara

This is the latest, most interactive and one-of-a-kind chocolate museum providing a hands-on and real-life approach to education while making available over 100 chocolate brands for sale to the public. Visitors can also try their hand at chocolate making while discovering how chocolate actually changed the world.



### Kompleks Taman Seni Islam

This is a gallery and cultural centre with exhibitions on contemporary Islamic art and calligraphy, architecture, interior design & Quran manuscripts. The centre serves as an exhibition and production centre for the Yayasan Restu (Restu Foundation), a non-profit organisation dedicated to the revival, preservation and promotion of Islamic arts and culture.

**Galeri Shah Alam**

The Galeri Shah Alam was the brainchild of HRH Sultan Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah with the building itself displaying characteristics of Malay carving and design which is in line with its objectives of creating greater awareness of, and an appreciation of art in the multi-cultural society that makes up the state of Selangor.



**Wet World Water Park, Shah Alam**

Described as a value for money and family-oriented park, Wet World Water Park has about a dozen rides that include Super Hurricane, Thunder River, Monsoon Buster, Caribbean Rider, Whirlwind Escape and more. The park actively promotes itself as the ideal host for group functions, carnivals, family days, corporate events and parties.

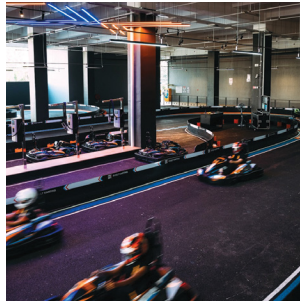


**Sultan Alam Shah Museum**

Established in 1974, and named after Sultan Hisamuddin Alam Shah, the seventh Sultan of Selangor, the buildings design is based on Minangkabau architecture and houses nearly 4,000 artefacts within its 135,000 square feet of space. 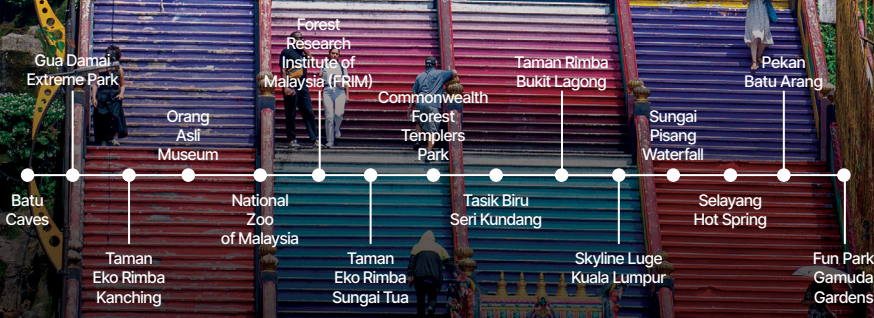

**Batu Caves**

Batu Caves is actually a series of limestone caves containing several Hindu temples of which the one dedicated to Lord Murugan is the largest. This is where the world-renowned Thai Pusam Festival is celebrated annually, with over 1.5 million devotees and visitors, climbing the 272 steps to the temple.



**Gua Damai Extreme Park**

This location is popular as both a training spot as well as the place to test your skills on rock climbing and skateboarding. And for those seeking a death defying experience, check out the base jumping!



**Taman Eko Rimba Kanching**

This forest reserve offers adventurers ample opportunities for camping and hiking, as well as having a number of natural swimming pools around the seven waterfalls located there.



**Orang Asli Museum**

This is a museum in Gombak showcasing the history and traditions of the indigenous Orang Asli people. Built with the objective of being a reference point for historical events and artefacts related to the aborigines of Peninsular Malaysia, it facilitates research into the history and background of the aboriginal community.



### **National Zoo of Malaysia**

Officially opened in 1963, the zoo has over the years transformed itself to an open concept facility with over 90% of its animals being kept in spacious exhibits with landscape befitting the nature of the animal. Today, it houses over 3,500 specimens from 305 species of mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fishes.



### **Forest Research Institute of Malaysia (FRIM)**

FRIM is a premier research institution in Malaysia dedicated to the advancement of forestry and forest related research, development, conservation and commercialisation. Activities here include canopy walks, jogging and nature trekking, camping as well as mountain biking.



### **Taman Eko Rimba Sungai Tua**

Located some 10 kilometres away from Bandar Baru Selayang, the Sungai Tua Recreational Forest has a river that runs through the park and the location includes a number of facilities such as BBQ areas and gazebos for picnics.



### **Commonwealth Forest Tempplers Park**

A myriad of features including landscaped gardens, lakes, camping grounds, chalets, fountains, jogging tracks, hiking trails and other amenities are available at this 620 hectare meaning that visitors would be spoilt for choice in an idyllic green getaway. Four designated camping zones with up to 51 sites are available.



### **Tasik Biru Seri Kundang**

A direct translation of this picturesque location would be "Kundang Blue Water Lake" which sums up this popular recreational and multi-purpose centre much frequented by the general public and a favourite of video production houses in the country as a film and television location.

**Taman Rimba Bukit Lagong**

A number of facilities are available here including fruit stalls, public amenities, two bridges as well as recreational activities such as a zip line and camping. Other activities include bird watching, fishing, jungle trekking, BBQs, campfires as well as amenities such as showers and restrooms, community kitchen, and ample parking.



**Skyline Luge Kuala Lumpur**

Luge was invented in 1985 and is a family-friendly thrill ride enjoyed by millions of people across the world. This exhilarating ride is designed and manufactured in New Zealand, and gives you full control over your descent, so you can enjoy the thrilling track features at your own speed. Skyline Luge Kuala Lumpur offers 4 purpose-built tracks with hairpin corners, exhilarating tunnels and downhill slopes.



**Sungai Pisang Waterfall**

At just over 3 kilometres long, this out and back trail is a relatively easy hike taking just over an hour to complete. Activities here include birding, camping and hiking with some of the best camping and picnic spots located near the top of the falls. This trail is open all year round.



**Selayang Hot Spring**

Not far from the Batu Caves are these naturally occurring hot springs located in the midst of lush green tropical rain forests with an ambiance that is both relaxing and potentially health enhancing as they are believed to have medicinal powers. Entrance is free and the hot springs are open 24 hours.

**Sultan Abdul Aziz Royal Gallery**

The Sultan Abdul Aziz Royal Gallery provides visitors with an insight into Selangor's cultural heritage and focuses on the legacy of the Selangor Royal family covering generations of tradition, artistry, and prestige. It emphasises the 39 year reign of Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz, the 8th Sultan and 11th King of Malaysia.



**Royal Klang Town Heritage Walk**

Klang is characterised by historic buildings and quaint, traditional structures. This free guided tour highlights it's charm, character and unique attractions including clusters of colonial sights, places of worship, a school, fire station, royal gallery, and warehouse built by a local Malay chieftain. The under 3km trail is relatively easy and takes about 2.5 hours to complete. It is conducted in English.



**Masjid Jamek Cina Muslim Klang**

Located in Bandar Botanik, Klang, the mosque sits on an area covering 2.98 acres and can accommodate 1,000 worshippers. It is the only mosque in Selangor with Chinese architectural features and also has library facilities, lecture rooms, management offices, rooms for the Imams, lounges, souvenir shops and a restaurant.



**Pengkalan Batu Park**

Pengkalan Batu Park is a park situated in the middle of Klang Town on the border between North Klang and South Klang. This park is a family friendly destination for leisure and outdoor activities and is located along the Klang River, thus allowing visitors to explore and enjoy the view of Masjid Bandar, Klang. There are restaurants, huts and recreational spots for public use.

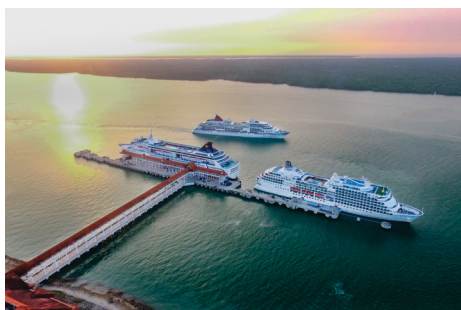
### Klang Royal Town Mosque

The mosque is located at Jalan Pasar on the banks of the Klang River, giving it the image of being a floating mosque. Built on the site of an older mosque, the Klang Royal Town Mosque was completed in 2009 and apart from the main prayer hall, is equipped with offices, lecture rooms, an outdoor prayer area, funeral management rooms, and catering facilities.



### GM Klang Wholesale City

GM Klang Wholesale City is a popular one-stop wholesale destination, and welcomes local and regional traders, shoppers and tourists. GM Klang Wholesale City has over 2,500 stores under one roof, including a wide array of products and food & beverage outlets, as well as both wholesale and retail sales covering fashion, health & beauty, home & living, kids & babies, IT & accessories, gifts & others.



### Port Klang Cruise Terminal

The Port Klang Cruise Terminal is the leading cruise terminal in Malaysia and ranks among the most visited in Asia. The port has three berths able to cater to vessels of varying sizes and has the ability to provide seamless guest experiences from embarkation to disembarkation.



### Istana Alam Shah

Completed in 1960, Istana Alam Shah features interesting downhill steps that lead to manicured gardens. The two horseshoe-shaped porches flank the front of the palace with the main porch reserved for royalty and dignitaries. Its elevated location on a hill provides a clear view of Sultan Suleiman Shah Mosque.

**PLACES OF INTEREST****Pulau Ketam**

Pulau Ketam, or Crab Island, is home to two predominantly Chinese fishing villages and established around 1880. Homes here comprise mostly of structures built on stilts and access to the island is by way of ferry from Port Klang. The main reason for visitors to the island are for the fresh, affordable seafood, especially crabs. The island can be explored by foot or on rented scooters.

**Tanjung Harapan, Pelabuhan Klang**

Tanjung Harapan is a 2.5 to 3km stretch of seaside promenade where visitors can enjoy the ocean breeze. It has excellent views of the cape, and pavilions and raised gazebos dot the wide walkway with a number of eateries offering grilled fish located at the midway and northern points of Tanjung Harapan. Fishing off the rocks nearby or from privately owned jetties is possible. Swimming is not permitted here.

**Jalan Tengku Kelana (Little India)**

Also known as 'Little India' this street was once a major economic hub for the Malay and Chinese communities. Located in the centre of the city, it began to evolve into what it is today in the early 1900s, when a number of Indian-Muslim businesses and restaurants settled in the area and now has shops selling fabrics, fragrant spices and outstanding Indian cuisine.

**Klang Heritage Safari Walk 3D Street Murals**

The art street of Klang covers the back alley and side lanes between Jalan Tengku Diaudin and Jalan Dato Hamzah, a short distance from the Klang Commuter station. A huge variety of art covers most of the street, and from a number of different artists. Subjects include prehistoric animals and wildlife including cheetahs, elephants, giraffes, various species of birds and others, hence the term 'safari'.

**Congkak Park and Resort**

This secondary forest reserve serves as an ideal weekend getaway and is part of the Titiwangsa Mountain Range. The park has a multitude of flora and fauna, making it a favourite destination for city dwellers. Changing rooms, toilets, BBQ pits and rest huts are available, while camping sites come at a small fee.



**Skytrex Adventure Sg Congkak**

This adventure sports park is located in the cool and hilly area of Hulu Langat. The Congkak Park and Resort is where Skytrex Adventure organises various activities including team building events, camping, ziplining, ropeways, obstacle games and more!



**Air Terjun Sungai Gabai**

This multi-level cascading waterfall. The trek up the falls include climbing up concrete steps and passing through a number of picnic spots surrounded by gushing torrents of water amidst lush green forests. The Sungai Gabai waterfalls are especially well known for its many picture perfect photography spots



**Paradise Valley Broga Resort**

Paradise Valley is nestled in the serene hills of Broga Semenyih and is perfect for getaways, family outings, or corporate retreats. Accommodation is available and activities include rain forest walks, kayaking, flying fox, rock climbing, camping, cycling, board games, and more.



### Kajang Heritage Centre

The Kajang Heritage Centre was established by the Federation of Chinese Associations with the objective of promoting local history and heritage and to engage people in community building. The centre conducts guided tours along Kajang Heritage Walk which includes the heritage centre, temple, and heritage sites.



### Bukit Broga

Broga Hill is one of the most popular destinations for outdoor activities in Selangor with an easy to moderate hiking trail. The peak is around 400 metres above sea level and from here hikers can continue to Gunung Tok Wan and Puncak 18. The top of Broga Hill has one of the best views in Selangor.



### Sungai Tekala Recreational Forest

The Sungai Tekala Amenity Forest is a lowland Dipterocarp Reserved Forest. Activities here include birding, hiking, camping, mountain climbing and swimming while a range of public amenities including public parking, changing facilities, rest huts and food stalls are available for a quick country getaway.



### Gunung Nuang Amenity Forest

This is the tallest mountain in Selangor, and the park surrounding it includes chalets and dormitories for visitors to station themselves while preparing to summit Gunung Nuang which takes an average of 4 to 5 hours.

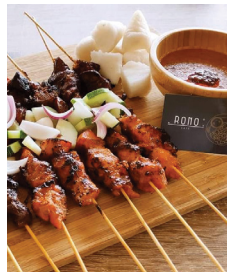


**Dino Desert**

**Fo Guang Shan Dong Zen Temple**

The temple's vast and peaceful compound comprises a main shrine housing a giant Buddha statue, teahouse, garden, calligraphy hall, exhibition halls, audiovisual rooms, as well as meditation and dining halls. Short monastic retreats, meditation camps, and more are organised here.



**Mah Meri Cultural Village**

The cultural village is a wonderful repository for those interested in discovering more about the fascinating way of life of the Mah Meri, an ethnic group native to the western part of Peninsular Malaysia. Cultural shows, arts and handicraft making, traditional games, and hearty lunches are available.



**Jugra Hill Paragliding**

Jugra Hill's resplendent buildings stand as testament to the important role it played in trade and maritime traffic in the area. These days however, it is better loved for the recreational activities it avails visitors including hiking and paragliding, which takes place from the base of the Jugra Hill lighthouse 146 metres above sea level.



**Discovery Park @ Gamuda Cove**

This adventure park is ideal for team-building and adventure seekers. **Amverton Riverine Splash**

This is a family focused water theme park offering an array of slides, rides, and relaxing attractions for all ages. Whether you seek adrenaline-pumping excitement or serene relaxation, Riverine Splash has it all.



**Istana Bandar**

Istana Bandar is located in Kampung Bandar, Jugra, Selangor. The 5th Sultan of Selangor, Sultan Sir Ala'eddin Sulaiman Shah, lived here for 35 years and welcomed many foreign dignitaries, as well as also holding many social and religious ceremonies. The palace is currently used as a centre for Quranic studies and houses the Selangor Islamic Religious Department.



**Sultan Ala'eddin Royal Mosque**

The Sultan Ala'eddin Royal Mosque is one of the oldest royal mosques in Selangor, and officially opened in 1906 by Almarhum Sultan Sir Ala'eddin Sulaiman Shah of Selangor. It has traditional Moorish, Mughal and English architectural influences and accommodates around 500 worshippers. The mosque was gazetted as a National Heritage Site in 2008.

**PLACES OF INTEREST****Morib Beach**

This fascinating beach is filled with historical significance including ruined government buildings, royal graves and an abandoned palace. But the beach has a wealth of natural beauty including Casuarina and palm trees surrounding a beach front that stretches into the Straits of Malacca. There is a coastal promenade, picnic pavilions and public amenities.

**Paya Indah Discovery Wetlands**

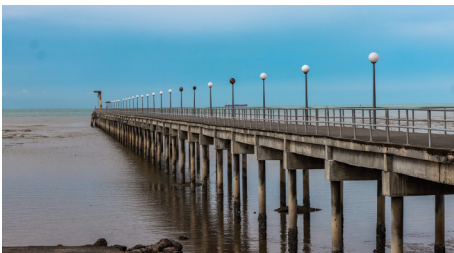
Explore 1,111 acres of wetlands and home to a variety of wildlife including crocodiles, and an immigrant hippopotamus. Catch a glimpse of the wide variety of marshland birds and engage in a spot of fishing, or take a leisurely boat cruise or an exciting hot air balloon ride and much more.

**Jugra Insitu Museum**

Jugra Insitu Museum opened in 2012, and was originally a district police station. Gazetted as an old monument or historic land site, the museum has three exhibition halls displaying a variety of information about the Kuala Langat district, and the history of the Selangor sultanate including the results of excavations such as prison structures, mini courts, old wells and others.

**Taman Rekreasi Paya Bakau Sijangkang**

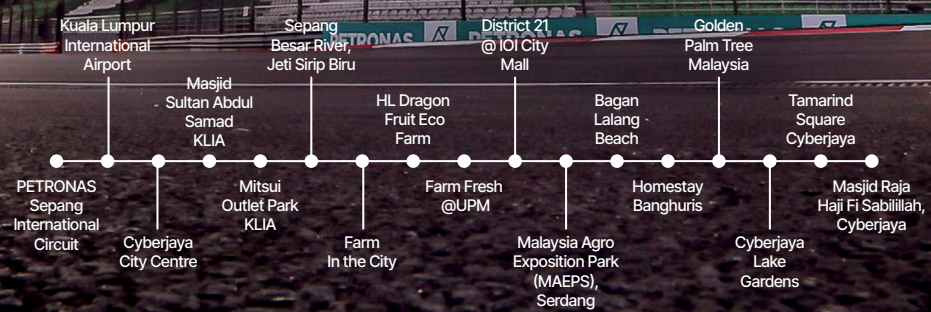
Located in Sijangkang, Kuala Langat, this park exudes with the natural beauty of its mangrove swamps and rivers and has an "edu-tourism" project and an 800-metre long boardwalk, allowing for an easy half hour walk through the mangroves and Nipah palms. Other facilities include camping, cycling, jogging and viewing marine life.

**Lover's Bridge, Tanjung Sepat**

The inspiration for this destination's name most likely came about because it is an ideal location for long romantic evening walks, with its long concrete pier leading out to the sea. The Lover's Bridge has a jetty at the end that allows fishing boats to anchor at low tide. Today, it is a tourist attraction to watch ships sail by against a backdrop of long stretches of coastline.

**PETRONAS Sepang International Circuit**

Petronas Sepang International Circuit is a motorsport race track in Sepang, Selangor, and hosted the Formula One Malaysian Grand Prix between 1999 and 2017. It is also the venue for the Malaysian Motorcycle Grand Prix, the Malaysia Merdeka Endurance Race and other major motorsport events.



**Cyberjaya City Centre**

Cyberjaya is a city with a science park as its core that forms part of Greater Kuala Lumpur, in Malaysia. It is located in Sepang District, Selangor. Cyberjaya is adjacent to and developed along with Putrajaya, Malaysia's government seat. The city aspires to be known as the Silicon Valley of Malaysia.



**Kuala Lumpur International Airport (Terminals 1 & 2)**

The Kuala Lumpur International Airport comprises two terminals and ranks among the worlds busiest airports, handling close to 60 million passengers annually. In 2024 it was ranked first for global low-cost connections as well as being placed second overall in the same year by ratio of flight frequency to destinations served. The airport is located approximately 45 kilometres from Kuala Lumpur city.



### Masjid Sultan Abdul Samad KLIA

The Sultan Abdul Samad Mosque or KLIA Mosque is of a classical Arabic architectural style located near Kuala Lumpur International Airport in the Sepang District of Selangor. Opened in 2000, and covering an area of almost 18 acres, the mosque has a capacity for 8,000 congregants.



### Mitsui Outlet Park KLIA

This is a factory outlet shopping mall located 60km from KL and 6km from KLIA and KLIA2. It offers a myriad of upper-middle to high-end off season brands and products at attractive discounts, as well as an array of cuisine ranging from authentic Malay, oriental to western delights, cafes and a food court.



### Sepang Besar River, Jeti Sirip Biru

River cruises are available along the Sepang Besar River as well as boat rentals and raft houses suitable for the entire family. Activities include fish and monkey feeding, fishing and a tour of the mangrove marshes. This one-stop fishing centre caters to fishing enthusiasts.



### Farm In the City

Possibly closer to being a zoo than a farm, this attraction offers visitors an up close and personal look at birds and animals from around the world including such exotic creatures as lemurs, raccoons, meerkats, as well as a variety of birds, reptiles and more, setting a 'most number of animal species' record at a petting zoo.

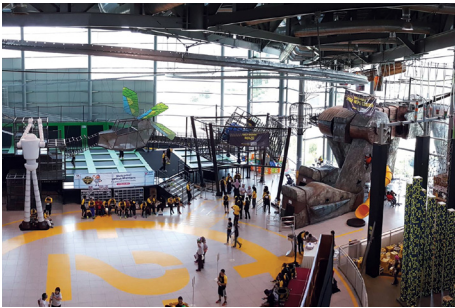
**HL Dragon Fruit Eco Farm**

**Farm Fresh @ UPM**

This is an educational and fun way of learning about the production of the natural goodness of milk. **District 21 @ IOI City Mall**

Part of a large shopping complex, this park is a first of its kind, an apocalypse themed adventure park located in a 52,000 sq.ft, indoor premise with a 55ft airconditioned atrium, within the IOI City Mall, Putrajaya. It has 8 prominent attractions and 5 function rooms, and activities include climbing, jumping, riding, sliding and flying.



**Malaysia Agro Exposition Park (MAEPS), Serdang**

Established by the Ministry of Agriculture and Agrobased Industry to serve as a centre for agro-based events and activities, MAEPS is a major exhibition venue, and an important centre for both international and local events and activities in Malaysia.



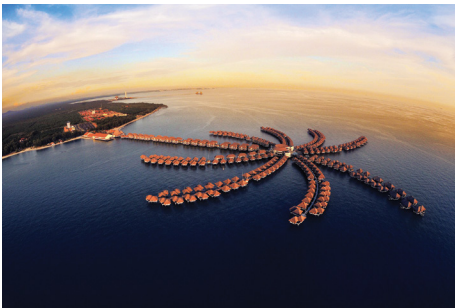
### **Bagan Lalang Beach**

Just an hours drive from Kuala Lumpur is this well developed beach with food courts, paved pathways and public toilets. The primary activities here include fishing, kite-flying, BBQs, water sports activities such as kayaking and there are also facilities for camping.



### **Homestay Banghuris**

This is an unassuming home-stay offering guests the opportunity to experience living in a Javanese village in Malaysia. ### **Cyberjaya Lake Gardens**
